

Ruby Falls and Treetop Hideaways Open Luxury Treehouse Lodging

Boutique Treehouses Blend Luxury Travel with Rustic Design

(CHATTANOOGA, TN) Ruby Falls and Treetop Hideaways have officially opened a new luxury treehouse lodging location on Lookout Mountain.

Overlooking the Cumberland Plateau and Tennessee River, three rustic and refined treehouses are now available for booking. Each treehouse is built with carefully curated reclaimed materials, creating the feel of a childhood tree fort while providing the amenities expected in a luxurious hotel suite.



Nestled among the mossy boulders and towering trees in the forest above historic Ruby Falls Castle circa 1929, the treehouses can accommodate 2 - 5 guests. Each uniquely styled treehouse includes breathtaking views of the Tennessee Valley, a private fire pit with s'more kits and firewood, and either a private outdoor shower or a soaking tub (in addition to an indoor shower).

A Perfect Partnership

After opening luxury treehouses in Flintstone, Georgia in 2014, **Treetop Hideaways** has been featured in national and international press including, Animal Planet's Treehouse Masters, Travel & Leisure, Garden and Gun, twice ranked in the Top 5 Treehouses in the US by Glamping Hub and were the first tree-supported structures in the country to be permitted as state-certified tourist accommodations by undergoing rigorous engineering and safety inspections.

Redbud Treehouse

Every part of this treehouse has a story, from the barnwood oak and reclaimed tin ceilings to the quilt curtains and the wrought iron railing. The lower level features a luxurious leather couch that can be pulled out into a cozy queen bed, while the loft is adorned with a beautiful carved oak queen bed. Outside, flowering redbud tree canopies press tight against the wraparound deck, featuring an outdoor soaking tub tastefully hidden in a private alcove.



Wood Lily Treehouse

The Wood Lily Treehouse brings nature indoors, creating a wonderful blend of indoor and outdoor spaces.

As a top tourist destination in the country, **Ruby Falls** excels at providing unique outdoor adventure experiences that have delighted and inspired guests since 1929. The collaboration with Treetop Hideaways to bring treehouses to Ruby Falls creates one more layer of wonder and adventure to the Lookout Mountain attraction.



Upon entering this treehouse, the charred oak siding stands in contrast with the natural cork flooring inside. The kitchenette highlights a petrified wood sink on a beautiful black walnut countertop. The bathroom features a custom vanity with a teak wood sink, a hovering “egg” toilet, reclaimed slate, and exposed copper plumbing for an indoor and outdoor rain head shower!



Dogwood Treehouse

The Dogwood Treehouse is the perfect blend of rustic treehouse playfulness and refined flair. This wheelchair accessible treehouse provides a comfortable queen bed and a floor to ceiling view of the Tennessee River. Reclaimed doors, windows, and floors create a unique ambiance, paired with rough sawn oak and locally sourced black walnut custom countertops and shelving. Outside is a wraparound deck, a large lounging hammock, and a fully stocked fire pit.
