Park Overview

Ruby Falls is home to the tallest underground waterfall open to the public in the United States. The park, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, offers guided tours of the cave discovered 97 years ago, soaring ziplines, breathtaking views of the Cumberland Plateau, luxury treehouse lodging, and a historic castle featuring a casual and beautiful private event venue. Welcoming over half a million visitors annually, the park's diverse ecosystem fosters deep connections to nature through unique adventures on Lookout Mountain in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Pick a cave adventure and descend 260 feet by glass-front elevator into the cavern hidden deep within Lookout Mountain. Explore the cave on a guided walk along the scenic trail to the breathtaking waterfall. Discover the cave's history, see ancient geological formations, experience the waterfall lightshow, and get inspired by nature.

Our Story: Big Dreams & Accidental Discovery



Ruby and Leo Lambert

Leo Lambert learned about the rich history and folklore of Lookout Mountain Cave shortly after he married his high school sweetheart, Ruby Losey, in 1916. He spent the next decade researching ways to access the long-sealed cave and open it to the public.

Finally in 1928, backed by \$250,000 from investors, Leo hired a crew, and they began excavating a 420-foot elevator shaft through solid limestone. If calculations were correct, the elevator would descend into Lookout Mountain Cave. Park visitors would board the elevator from a stately limestone castle.

At a depth of 260-feet below ground, they unexpectedly uncovered a narrow opening. Leo spent 17 hours exploring the mysterious passage, discovering underground streams, dramatic ancient rock formations, and a plunging waterfall which Leo named Ruby Falls, in honor of his wife.

Excavation continued another 160 feet, reaching Lookout Mountain Cave! Leo's calculations were correct, and Lookout Mountain Cave opened to the public amid great excitement in December 1929, followed by Ruby Falls Cave six months later.

Although the nation was struggling through the Great Depression, Leo's vision for the park endured and the park was a symbol of resilience. Visiting Ruby Falls became a cherished tradition, shared between generations.

Leo Lambert's determination and love for adventure forged a legacy. Ruby Falls continues to inspire guests, blending the timeless wonder of nature and adventure with southern hospitality and priceless memories.

RUBY FALLS

Conservation

Recognized as a leader in tourism sustainability, Ruby Falls is committed to inspiring extraordinary connections to nature by protecting and preserving the natural wonders of the cave and park for generations to come.

Ruby Falls is the first attraction in the United States to earn Green Globe certification, the respected worldwide standard for sustainability; and a recipient of the Governor's Environmental Stewardship Award for Excellence in Building Green. The park's Atrium Hospitality Center, Village Gift Shop and Village Plaza are Bronze LEED certified. The park, including Ruby Falls Cave and historic Ruby Falls Castle, circa 1929, are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Water and energy conservation, electric vehicle charging stations, solar energy, reduction of emissions, LED lighting, recycling, natural habitat protection, organic waste composting, sourcing sustainable business products, using environmentally sensitive building design and materials, plus a 16,000-gallon rainwater collection system for irrigation are just a few of the ways sustainability is at the core our business practices.

Accessibility Overview

Low sensory tours available by request with two weeks advance notice. Due to natural formations throughout the cave, there are narrow passages and small groupings of steps; the cavern is not wheelchair or stroller accessible. Cave adventure guests must be ambulatory. Designated parking for guests with a valid handicap parking permit.

Wheelchair accessible venues include: Blue Heron Overlook, Village Plaza, Skyline Loft Event Venue, Hospitality Atrium, Village Gift Shop, Back Porch Dining (seasonal), Restrooms, Castle Café, Castle Front Porch. Historic Lookout Mountain Tower viewing decks built prior to current accessibility standards are accessed by stairs. Cave Adventures

Adventure awaits!

Discover ancient geological wonders and a thundering waterfall hidden deep within Lookout Mountain on a guided cave adventure. The scenic journey to the waterfall begins in a glass-front elevator descending 260 feet into historic Lookout Mountain followed by a guide-led walk along the cavern trail with up-close views of remarkable formations. The round-trip walk is just under 1-mile and the year-round, 60-degree cave temperature keeps guests comfortable.

CAVE WALK TO THE WATERFALL Daily


See the hidden beauty of Ruby Falls with an express Cave Walk to the Waterfall led by a Ruby Falls guide. The express walk features a basic overview of the cave with video and audio presentations in a large group format. Learn the story behind the cave's accidental discovery, see stunning ancient geological formations and experience the thundering waterfall. Admission includes a short movie, light show at the waterfall, guided walk, and access to historic Lookout Mountain Tower and Blue Heron Overlook, giving sweeping views of the Cumberland Plateau.

LOW-SENSORY CAVE WALK TO THE WATERFALL

Available by request with advance reservation.

Low sensory tours provide a guided, early-access, reduced-sensory walk through the cavern to the waterfall. The adventure is customized for the comfort level of guests with special sensory needs and their families. This experience is available by advance request at 7:45 AM, Monday-Friday, with a minimum 2-week notice.

LANTERN TOUR

Friday After Hours, and by Advance Request for Groups of 8 or More

Explore the waterfall and cavern on an after-hours Friday night tour, illuminated only by the light of hand-held lanterns. Ancient formations take on intriguing dimensions in the shadows as guides share stories exclusive to this tour and light the falls using a system of pulleys and lanterns, creating an unforgettable Friday night. This specialty tour features extra time at the waterfall, a smaller group experience and a laid-back pace. See the moonlit view and star filled sky from historic Lookout Mountain Tower. Guests younger than 10 years old are not permitted on Lantern Tours.

GENTLE WALKING TOUR

Gentle Walking Tours offer a slower-paced journey through the cavern with early-access to the waterfall and in-depth information with a senior-level guide. This specialty tour, ideal for anyone preferring a very gentle pace and a love of history, is available select dates, year-round. Gentle Walking Tours include extra time at the waterfall, viewing of the mini-movie presentation of The Story of Ruby Falls, waterfall lightshow, and is limited to a small number of participants. This experience is for adults and children ages 12+

Scenic Views

Views of the Cumberland Plateau and Tennessee River are exceptional due to the park's ideal vantage point on Lookout Mountain. Upper and lower decks of Historic Lookout Mountain Tower, built in 1929, and wheelchair accessible Blue Heron Overlook offer unmatched views of the peaceful Tennessee River, green valleys, and rolling Appalachian mountain ranges.

COLORBLIND VIEWFINDER

Selected as one of the 13 most scenic overlooks in Tennessee, Ruby Falls received a special viewfinder outfitted with an innovative lens designed to enable people with colorblindness to see a wider range of vibrant, true colors. With the viewer, created by the Tennessee Department of Tourist Development, more folks can fully experience the colorful beauty of the region.

HISTORIC RUBY FALLS CASTLE

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Ruby Falls Castle has welcomed generations of guests eager to explore Lookout Mountain's underground caverns and the park's diverse ecosystem since 1929. Designed by Chattanooga master architect, R.H. Hunt to resemble a 15th-century castle, it is a beloved landmark built with limestone excavated during the construction of the elevator shaft and cavern trail. The historic Castle's original restaurant and tearoom opened with the park in 1929, quickly becoming a favorite gathering place for Chattanoogans, a tradition lasting decades. Today, the Castle features a casual cafe, private event venue, and cave explorers still board the elevator in the Castle, just like folks in 1929.

HISTORIC LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN TOWER

As part of the castle built in 1929 with limestone excavated during construction of the Ruby Falls elevator shaft, Lookout Mountain Tower offers unmatched views from lower and upper decks. The mesmerizing, 360-degree panoramic view is exceptional.



Climb + Soar

HIGH POINT ZIP ADVENTURE at RUBY FALLS

In partnership with the nation's premier climbing gym, High Point ZIP Adventure at Ruby Falls offers the ultimate zipline and climbing experience with gliding ziplines and 40-foot climbing tower with auto-belays and routes of varying difficulty. High Point ZIP Adventure is a seasonal, separately ticketed park activity.

CASTLE CAFE

Castle Café returns the historic castle to its 1929 vintage roots, when memories were made around the table with great food and dear ones. Enjoy a casual seasonal menu and local craft beer with table seating inside the historic castle by the original stone fireplace or outside on the castle's covered front porch and seasonal Back Porch at umbrella shaded tables. Serving breakfast, lunch, dinner, snacks, coffee, fountain drinks, local craft beer on tap and dessert. Dine in and take out.
